

Rowing news: JKS v The Tideway

The J13 coxed quad became the first JKS crew to row on part of the University Boat Race Course last Saturday when they travelled up to London to take part in the Barnes and Mortlake Regatta. George, Theo, Jasper, Bear (stroke) and Nanthana (cox) nobly gave up the first part of their exeat (and a precious lie-in) to compete. Many parents shared their pain, the early start and (even more nobly) braved the M25 to drive them to the event.

Our crew was drawn against Emmanuel School, who were very much on home water, and we had to race against their J14 boat due to an absence of younger competition. This was always going to be tough but we managed the 1000 metre course and tricky tidal conditions very successfully. Strength and experience paid off for the Emmanuel boys but we were not disgraced and finished smoothly five or so lengths behind.

This race was the culmination of a year of preparation, developing skills and a level of fitness which will ensure that our rowers get off to a rapid start in the King's rowing programme next year. We hope that they continue to support each other and look forward to hearing of their successes and perhaps seeing them making up the core of an Eight at Henley in years to come. /NC
